ANNIVERSARY: Group signs MoU with MyKasih to support women's programme

MEDIVIRON UOA Clinic recently unveiled its newly-renovated facility in conjunction with its 12th anniversary.

The clinic had also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with MyKasih Foundation, a non-profit organisation, to establish a programme that will assist the urban poor and needy to generate additional income.

Mediviron will contribute a percentage to promising participants who attend the four-month comprehensive self-sustainable skills programme called "Mengecapi Aspirasi Diri".

The programme aims to coach and transform the lives of women who receive food aid across the country through the MyKasih Foundation to be financially independent and emotionally liberated.

The programme will be conducted in partnership with LifeWorks Bhd targeting 25 participants from the urban poor segment within the Klang Valley.

Participants will be taken through

the steps of personal transformation. Training modules will be delivered through coaching, experiential learning, activities, role plays, facilitation, and lectures.

The knowledge and exposure will help participants change their lives and break out of the poverty cycle. This in turn will ensure their children have access to proper education.

"Living in the city can be stressful and challenging to many families.

"We have come across those who are in dire need and many of whom have untold stories.

"As we celebrate our 12th anniversary, we felt it is timely to work with MyKasih Foundation to spread the message to the poor that they deserve better and that Mediviron UOA Aesthetic Clinic is here to help," said of Mediviron UOA Clinic aesthetic physician and owner Dr Chen Tai Ho.

The partnership between Mediviron UOA Clinic and MyKasih Foundation was formed between Dr Chen and MyKasih Foundation chairman and co-Founder Dr Ngau Boon

Keat.
